
Lorane Rebekah Lodge No. 252



We had our first board meeting of the year and I encourage you as members to attend these meetings as it will give you a chance to hear what is going on at the park and the direction we are headed. The board is going to be raising the rates to be inline with the other parks in the area. We will be affordable and still be offering more free amenities than they are. If you wish to voice your opinion on this PLEASE ATTEND THE NEXT PARK BOARD MEETING SATURDAY, JULY 4TH AT 10:00 AM. The new rates will not be in effect until after this summer camping season.

There are also some **changes** to the guideline book that you need to be aware of.

Extra vehicles with box (cargo) trailer that plug into electricity and are slept in are considered a camping vehicle and MUST HAVE THEIR SITE.

Prepaid reservations canceled with the caretakers 7 days prior to the SCHEDULED ARRIVAL DATE will be credited to the next stay.

Reservations made but not paid for will be held until 10:00 pm on the day of the scheduled arrival, unless notice of late arrival is given to the caretaker.

Members arriving a day later than reserved date will be charged for the previous day booked unless caretaker is notified by phone by the member prior to 10:00 pm closing time of the first night booked.

If a member or a guest of a member causes damage to the park they are responsible for the cost of repairs. For 1 year trial period the board is allowing a member

to put 1 item up for sale in their site.

Room rates are \$115.00 per night (Canadian funds plus applicable taxes). Breakfast is not included but there is an on-site café. Reservations can be made by calling 1-613-728-1951 or 1-800-268-5531 no later than **May 8, 2015**. Please inform the registration desk that you are with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows to receive this discounted rate. Rooms in our block are limited, so please **RESERVE EARLY**.

There will be a Meet and Greet Reception on Friday evening from 7-9 pm. Banquet tickets will be available for pick-up at that time.

On Saturday morning, arrangements have been made to visit the Governor General's Residence. Following this visit we will stop at the Byway Market. Members will have an opportunity to visit the many interesting novelty shops and have lunch. We will return to the hotel approx. 2 pm.

Our Annual Banquet will be held in the hotel dining room on Saturday June 6th. The evening will begin at 5:30 pm with a time of fellowship and a cash bar. A plated dinner will be served at 6:30 pm.
