The members and helpers got together to put the flags out to remember the members who have passed away. It is always nice to remember those who have gone on ahead of us and all the good they did while they were here.




United Nations Tour

As you read this article, the 2014 UNEP delegates from Oregon and Washington are on the East Coast. The Send-Off Dinner was on Friday, June 27th and they flew out of PDX the next morning. They will return on July 10th. Their itinerary includes: Touring Philadelphia, Ottawa, Niagara Falls, The Corning Glass Museum, Baltimore, Arlington Cemetery, the U.S. Capital, Supreme Court Building, The Library of Congress, The Smithsonian, and the Roosevelt, King, and WW II Memorials. While in New York City for 4 days, the Delegates will get briefings from representatives of the U.N., tour Fifth Avenue, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rockefeller Center, The Statue of Liberty, Ellis Island, The 911 Memorial, and see the Broadway play "NEWSIES".

We have 23 delegates being sponsored from Oregon this year. I want to thank everyone who has made this possible. I hope your lodge will keep in contact with these young people when they return and invite them to come visit your lodge.

The State UNEP committee has already been at work planning for next summer's trip. We have decided to select an essay topic that does not mention the United Nations for the first time. The essay topic for the 2015 UNEP tour is: "Of the places and landmarks that the UNEP tour will visit, which one are you most excited to see? Explain why."

This year the cost to lodges or areas in Oregon was \$1,800 per delegate. I would guess this will go up to \$1,850 or \$1,900 for the 2015 tour. The deadlines will probably remain the same. If your area sent a delegate this year, I will be contacting your area via email with more information the first of September. If your lodge was not active this year, please have someone contact me so I can get them information ASAP. I expect we will need to have delegates selected by the end of November.
