



Retha Kirby was born July 23, 1923 in Overton Nebraska. She moved to Oregon from Alberta Canada in 1937 to Garibaldi, Oregon.

She joined Prosperity Rebekah Lodge No. 104 in 1944. She transferred to Roseburg Rebkah Lodge in 1976. Retha joined Philitarian Odd Fellow Lodge No. 8 in February 2001. Retha was Rebekah Assembly President 1974-1975. She was Past President of the FL Clubs of Oregon, Representative at the International Association of Rebekah Assemblies and on the Schulyer Colfax Museum Board in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. She also chaperoned a United Nations Pilgrimage trip.

Retha was an active member of the Winston-Dillard Methodist Church, Umpqua Flathead's Club, Roseburg Visitor's Center, Rainbow Garden Club and on the Douglas County Community Hospital Auxiliary Board. She volunteered with the Salvation Army, DARE, United Way and many more. She transported senior citizens to appointments, contributed and supported the Camp Fire Girls for over 50 years. She also picked up litter on the roadside for the Adopt a Highway Program.

Retha said "You look after others that need it. From the time I was born it's all I can remember?" Retha passed away on July 30th, 2015 in Pensacola, Florida.




WHEN AND WHERE
