



Memorial Service for Samuel Eddy Joy

Lois Taylor, who is a member of the Burns Cemetery Committee, has been very involved with finding veterans that do not have head stones in the Burns Cemetery. Samuel was buried in the I.O.O.F. cemetery back in 1896, but the records were burned and no marker was found. Lois found his obituary in the local newspaper and through hard work obtained a beautiful head stone for Samuel.

Harney Lodge No. 77 along with the Harney Post No. 63 Burns American Legion performed the memorial service on October 20. At the conclusion, the American Legion Post gave Samuel 3 volleys to honor him.

Samuel Eddie Joy was born Dec. 18, 1848 and died Aug. 07, 1896. Samuel went into the service at the age of 16 years and mustered out six months later.

A total of 26 attended the ceremony. Samuel's head stone is proudly resting once again in the Odd Fellow cemetery section.

Tillamook Lodge No. 94 Holds Annual "Pumpkin Patch"

The 10th annual Odd Fellows Pumpkin Patch entertained and informed School District 9 preschool through third grade students. The event has been successful and popular with the students, teachers, and adults leading the program.



The Pumpkin patch is an outdoor event held in early October at the Odd Fellows Lodge located on Gienger Rd. Classes rotate through eight stations that explore agriculture and the outdoors. Most of the stations include hands-on projects that keep the students engaged. The activities change from year to year depending on the skills and interests of the volunteers. One of the stations each year gives the students time to pick a pumpkin from the patch to take home.

Eleven years ago, Hayden Bush, now a local farmer and teacher, was an FFA member at Tillamook High School. He and classmate Kristen Kaste decided to take on the Farm Fest Program as a senior project. According to Brett Hurliman, the Tillamook IOOF wanted to find a use for their property on Gienger Road. The idea of a pumpkin patch and the Farm Fest program with the schools came together after Hurliman met with Max Sherman, Tillamook High School's agriculture teacher, and Ed Armstrong, a grant writer and Educator. Together, with Busch and Kaste, they created a format that was approved as a field trip for School District 9.

There have been many groups and individuals that have volunteered to operate stations. They include: Brooklyn Bush FFA, Karl Zweiffel (corn maze), Gary Albright (Tillamook Museum), Garibaldi Coast Guard Station, Aubry Olson (OSP), David Helmricks (State Forestry). Tillamook County Rodesio Association, YMCA, 4H, School District 9, and Food Roots. Rex Trogden, an officer of the Tillamook Odd Fellows, said

that the Odd Fellows are always looking for new station ideas and contributions. Students have attended this event for four years. New ideas for stations are always needed.
