### Thomas Wildey...The Fruition of His Dreams Lives On Today

The Founding Hand By Myrtle Russell, President IARA From the International Odd Fellow April 26, 1969



The first time I visited Baltimore, some of the members of the Rebekah Assembly of Maryland took me to what I term a sacred spot...to the monument of Thomas Wildey, Founder of our Order.

To me this was a highlight in the many years I have been a Rebekah.

On the shaft of the monument is this inscription:

"He who realizes that the true mission of a man on earth is to rise above the level of individual influence...and to recognize the fatherhood of God over all, and the brotherhood of man, is nature's true nobleman."

The story of the founding of our Order is well known to all versed in the principles of Friendship, Love and Truth. Through all those early days, Thomas Wildey was at the head of the Order, first as Noble Grand of Washington No. 1, *Continued on page 11...*



I sent letters to all the Odd Fellow and Rebekah lodges throughout the state concerning the Odd Fellow and Rebekah Pilgrimage for Youth. The deadline to send these letters back to the Grand Lodge of Oregon is February 15, 2018. It states in the questionnaire letter that we are requesting a copy of your By-laws to also be sent back with the letters. Several lodges have sent only the questionnaire and did not include the By-laws. So please, if you have not sent your By-laws to the Grand Lodge do so by February 15, 2018. If you have any questions in this matter, please contact me, I'm available to assist you.

There have been several questions concerning whether or not you need to place the anti-discrimination policy in your By-laws. YOU DO NEED to include them in your By-laws. ### A Blast From The Past...

Continued from cover, Thomas Wildey: then as Grand Master of Maryland and later as Grand Sire of the Grand Lodge of the United States, a post he held from 1825 to 1833. He devoted full time to his lodge work. He had retired from his trade and bought a restaurant which was run by members of his family. When suitable quarters could not be obtained, he gave this house as a place of meeting. When funds were not available, he gave liberally of his own money. He gave Odd Fellowship his labor, working for its advancement in his own city of Baltimore, traveling to other states and even going to England when necessary.


He lived to see the fruits of his labor. The Order took a firm hold in the community. Its membership improved in quality as well as quantity. It became better organized with a better system and a better ritual. It abolished old customs which were distasteful to the rising generation and separated from the Manchester Unity and became an Independent body. By 1833 it had spread into 12 states with more than 100 lodges and about 6,500 members. The time had passed for 1-man rule and Thomas Wildey stepped down as Grand Sire. He became a laborer in the ranks and devoted as much time as ever for his beloved Order. He gave advice and counsel when needed and watched with great gladness the Order he had founded.

He had unbounded enthusiasm. No task was too hard for him to perform; no difficulty was too great for him to overcome; no burden too heavy for him to carry. It was his energy that kept Odd Fellowship alive in its days of weakness and he supported it until it was strong enough to stand alone.
