# Grand Master E. V. Smith

Brothers and Sisters, it is a pleasure to serve the Order of I.O.O.F of Oregon as your Grand Master for the 2018/2019 year. As I sit here trying to think of something to type, my mind is blank, but that is normal for me some of the time. It is easier to talk to you than it is to type what



I want to say because the more I try, the harder it gets. As I sit here looking around I started thinking about the past and the present times of our Order, of how we have changed. Look at the way we interact with each other. In the past, we had to wait until we had our meetings to talk to one another. We didn't have cell phones or the internet. Most of you could even look back to the times that we didn't have television and in some cases telephone services. If you lived on a farm or in the country you had to depend on your neighbors. Some may have had a phone you could use or you waited until you went to town, which may have only been once a week.

I was just thinking about a dear friend of mine that is still a member of all the Orders. He is in a nursing home at the present time. Bud would tell me about how it used to be in the Odd Fellows. How it seemed that you and most your neighbors were in the Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, Grange, Masons, Elks and many other organizations and how they took pride in what they did. He told me how you would work hard to learn your charges and work your way up to the chair of your lodge. Bud and a lot of the old timers would talk about the dances and parties that they would have at the lodge hall and picnics once or twice a year. The dues where about 25 cents a night and the meetings were held once or twice a month come rain or snow. There was always more than enough members to fill the seats. Some of the members would have to start early to make it to lodge in time to change into their suits and ties. Now, in the present time, we have enough members to have a quorum to have a meeting. It seems like the younger people just do not have the time. They're always running here and there but getting nowhere.

The first time I went to Grand Lodge, the place was packed with members from all around the state. The Rebekahs in their formals and we were there for about

four or five days, depending on if you were in other parts of the Order. There were about 600 or more members from all the Orders there for Grand Lodge. We met members and friends that we hadn't seen for some time and we made friends of the new members that were coming for the first time. We stayed busy doing the work we needed to do on all the bills and reports for the year. At the same time, we had our elections of new officers for the upcoming year, along with the annual banquet and installation of the new officers.

It is hard to believe that we had over two hundred lodges in the state of Oregon. Now we have less than fifty lodges and hold a lot fewer members in the Order of Odd Fellows. We are not alone. All the other fraternal organazations have the same problem because it no longer fits in with the things that they want to do. We no longer visit our friends and members of the lodges and other organizations to find out what is happening here and around the world. We now use the computer and electronic devices to communicate without having that personal contact. As you can tell I'm one that misses the old ways a little. It would be fun to go back in time to see how it was back in the good old days, as they say. I can only hope that we can turn things around and start to recruit new members and maybe, just maybe, we could save our older lodges and start some new lodges.

At this time, I would like to the thank the family of Evelyn Campbell. It was her that introduced me to the Odd Fellows some years back. She was a true Rebekah through and through.

# Grand Secretary's Corner Ron Kunze

Brothers and Sisters,

I hope all of our Representatives made it safely home from our annual Grand Lodge sessions in Seaside, Oregon. I would like to reflect on some of the bills that were passed during our fun-filled sessions.



We passed Bill No. 6

The passage of this Bill allows the Grand Secretary to add a new donation account designated for scholarships. This account will allow Lodges to make donations into this new scholarship account. The distribution of such funds are decided by the Morand Fund Committee. This new Fund is not set up as an Endowment and all funds in this account can be awarded annually.

We passed Bill No. 1 and Bill No. 8,

This bill inserts a new Non-Discrimination policy into the Grand Lodge Constitution and also into the Constitution for all Odd Fellow Lodges.

We passed Bill No. 9, Bill No. 10 and Bill No. 11,

These Bills add the Rebekah Assembly Secretary and the Grand Secretary back into the Holgate Board of Directors as Board members with voting rights.

We passed Bill No. 12,

This Bill institutes new guidelines for the Morand Educational Fund Committee.

We passed Bill No. 3,

This Bill allows the Grand Secretary to pay bills by electronic approval via email from the Grand Treasurer and the Grand Trustees. The Grand Treasurer will be required to come to the Grand Lodge office within 30 days of any warrants paid out to sign the warrants and review the invoices paid.

We passed Bill No. 7,

This bill removes our last standing resolution and adds a new Amendment into the Grand Lodge By-laws for the Jacksonville Historic Lodge. Dues will be \$10.00 annually.

The following three Bills failed to pass:

Bill No. 2, Lodge Maintenance Assistance Fund, Bill No. 5, Lodge Maintenance Assistance Team

and Bill No. 4, Concerning elected members on Committee and Boards.

### **Parliamentary Pointers**

#### "DON'T BE A PROCESSIONARY CATEPILLAR"

In the world of nature there is a strange phenomenon known as a processionary caterpillar. He is ambitious, which is good, and he and his associates frequently climb to the top of the flower pot in search of food. Once having arrived there, however, these caterpillars form a circle around the edge of the flower pot, each one attaching himself to the caterpillar ahead, The interesting phenomenon is, that having done this, no caterpillar breaks the circle. They go 'round and 'round the flower pot until they have starved themselves to death, although food was close by.

As is so often true, this strange pattern in nature has its counterpart in man. All too often, after we have exercised the necessary initiative to get to where we want to go, we attach ourselves to the program, policy, and tradition of the leaders before us, each one of us reluctant or afraid to break the trend. It gives us a sense of security because things have been done that way before, and it makes the job much easier because there is a set pattern to follow. Such a practice shows no initiative or creativity, and merely keeps in motion the operations as practiced in prior years. Activity becomes dull and lifeless, and finally dies, just as the processionary caterpillar dies because he will not break the circle.

As a new leader (presiding officer), dare to be different; think of new and better ways in which your club can give service to your community and to yourselves, with the end result of an alive, progressive and prosperous club. As a new presiding officer, you have arrived at the top of the flower pot, and it is now your responsibility to the members to think creatively about your organization, and to cause to be put into action experimental ideas for its good. Clubs and organizations, just like the caterpillar, can starve to death if they simply hang on to the same old way of doing things.

Congratulations to each of you who has undertaken leadership service. Give wholeheartedly of your time, your talents, your efforts and your creative ability.

This was in the OPOF June of 2016, but it's a good message for new officers, so we're running it again.
