

Oregon Pacific Odd Fellow May 2019 Mawis M., Paull April 12, 1924 - April 1, 2019 Rebekah Assembly President 1971-1972 IARA President 1977 - 1978



Mavis Paull joined Riverside Rebekah Lodge No. 100 in Gardiner on May 22, 1942 days after her 18th birthday. Riverside consolidated with Three Rivers Rebekah Lodge in 1998.

She joined Gardiner Odd Fellow Lodge No. 132 on January 23, 2001. She was a member of White City LEA No. 69, an Associate of Salem Encampment in WA, an Associate of Theola Rebekah Lodge No. 63 in WA, an Associate of Canton No. 36 in WA. Mavis was married to Ralph Paull, Past Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Oregon. Ralph preceded Mavis in death.

Mavis was Rebekah Assembly President in 1971-1972, the International Association Rebekah Assemblies President 1977-1978. Mavis was a very active member, she belonged to all units. She traveled a lot and was well known in the Order around the world. It was said she never met a stranger, she could talk to anyone. In 1985 Mavis moved to Wintson-Salem, North Carolina to work for Sovereign Grand Lodge. Her title was Publicity, she did a lot of background work. She did so much for the Sovereign Grand Masters, they all said she was their private secretary. Vivian Pursell, Past IARA Secretary, who works at Sovereign Grand Lodge said Mavis loved crossword puzzles. She would print a copy for each of them to work on throughout the morning then they would meet at lunch to finish them. She was an avid reader and belonged to a library club. She wrote short stories about her travels and also some fiction. The (girls) as she called them, in her club loved her stories because she made them so animated, she was a great story teller. While she lived in Winston-Salem she became an associate member in Evangeline Rebekah Lodge No. 27 . Mavis worked for Sovereign Grand Lodge for around 30 years then she moved back to Oregon. She has been living in Paisley, OR with her son Ralph. Mavis died on April 1, 2019 at the age of 95, her ashes were scattered on Ralph's grave.
