Her songs were "Tea For Two", I think You Are wonderful and her fun song was "Marizy Doats". Joyce's hymns were "In My Heart There Rings a Melody" and The Church in the Wildwood". Joyce's projects were the Friendship Fund and Diabetes Association of Oregon.

Past Grand Master 1999 - 2000

Edward S. Tillis was born in Wheaton, Illinois on August 5, 1928. He earned a B.S. in Elementary Education in 1950 and a M.S. in Elementary Education in 1962. In August of 1962 he married Dolores Davis in Montana. Delores was a Life Member of all Lady Units of the Order. Ed joined Gardiner Lodge No. 132 on May 13, 1959. In 1965 he was elected Noble Grand and in 1968, Secretary, a position he held until 1978 when he was elected Treasurer. He is also an associate member of Heceta No. 111 where in 1990 he filled the chair of Nobel Grand. Ed is a Life Member of all branches of the Order. In 1959, he joined Three Rivers Rebekah Lodge No. 240, where he served two years as Secretary. In 1959 he received the Royal Purple Degree after joining White City Encampment No. 69. In 1982 he was elected Grand Treasurer of the Grand Encampment and continued in that position until 1994. He was decorated Grand Treasurer Emeritus for his dedication to the Order and his diligent work. In 1966 he joined Canton Unity No. 12, he served as Captain twice. He advanced to Department Commander in 1994 and was promoted to Brigadier General upon his appointment as Medical Officer of the General Military Council. An active member at Jesse T. Jones Odd Fellow Park, Ed served two tours on the Administrative Board. Once from 1983-1987 the from 1993-1996. He worked seven years with the Boy Scouts, held various offices on the Lower Umpqua Senior Center Advisory Board. He worked with the AARP Food Program for 18 years. He sang in the church choir, served as courier for the hospital, cooked breakfast for the hospital softball tournaments and was on call for several years as a volunteer EMT for the Lower Umpqua Ambulance Service. 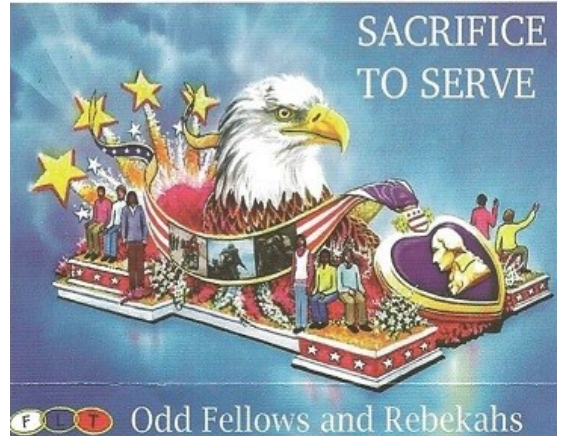

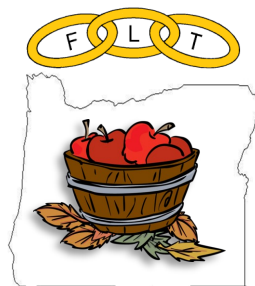
