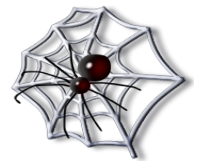

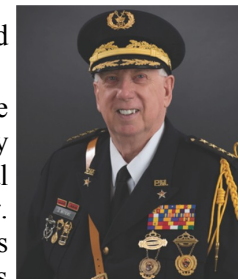
Northwest is in Portland, Oregon on November 4-6 and I hope to see many of you there. It is always good to visit with Sisters and Brothers.

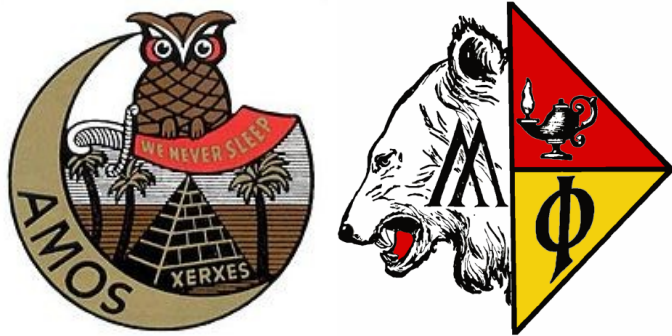

UNEP News: Announcing the 68th Annual United Nations Educational Pilgrimage for 2017. The UNEP Pilgrimage is scheduled for July 8, 2017 through July 18, 2017. The Send-Off dinner is July 7, 2017 at the Holgate Center.

Take a moment and visit WEB site <http://oregonunp.tripod.com/home.html> for full details.

Below is a summary of the highlights of the information contained on the WEB site.

TOPIC: 500 (minimum) word essay - "Describe the involvement of the United Nations in a current World Affair."

In Addition: 50 words or less (can go over 50 words) - "Why do you want to participate in this program?"

REQUIREMENTS: One (1) year left of high school & Age 16 or 17 during the Pilgrimage.

Must be at least 16 at the start of the trip.

Oregon's COST: \$1,945.00, includes airfare plus, and the State Committee will subsidize each Oregon student about \$455.00.

Out of State Student (Delegate) Cost: \$2,400.00 with no Oregon subsidy.

FIRST DUE DATE: Nov 26, 2016 for non-refundable deposit (\$975.00 payable to GRAND LODGE OF OREGON).
