Grand Secretary's Corner

Brothers and Sisters,

I hope you all have survived the heat. It sure got hot up here in Portland as we suffered temperatures of up to 106 degrees.

There has been a lot of questions concerning the conferring of degrees while we are still under the State of Oregon's Covid Guidelines.



Lodges that are open can still confer degrees but in a manner that protects the membership and follows the guidelines set forth by your county.

Please make sure you are following the guidelines closely. We had one Lodge that received a very stern warning from the county their building is in for ignoring the occupancy limit. It just so happened a county commissioner drove by and saw the infraction. They almost imposed a fine, but instead issued the warning. So, please respect the guidelines or your Lodge may end up paying a fine.

Many Lodges are still not allowing members into their buildings. In those Lodges, the Trustee's have met and weighed the safety options and have had to make decisions based on the safety of their members and their county's guidelines. Each county is different and it is the Lodge's job to ensure they are following the rules.

On May 30th of the year 2020 a message was sent to all Jurisdictions to let you know the Sovereign Grand Lodge sessions scheduled in August were cancelled by vote of the Sovereign Grand Lodge Representatives. This was done as set forth in the Sovereign Grand Lodge Code of General Laws: Chapter I, Article VII, Sections 3 & 4 respectively. Oregon Representative Votes for the Odd Fellows were Ronald Kunze, PGM (yes) and Gordon Corda, Grand Master (yes) and also with the votes from the following branches: Grand Encampment of Oregon Representative Kenneth "KC" Carr III (yes) and International Association of Rebekah Assemblies Representative Sheryl Rohde (yes). With an overwhelming count of yes votes the Sovereign Grand Lodge sessions were cancelled for 2020 to resume in August of 2021.

On August 14, 2020 another electronic request for votes was sent to all Jurisdictions to approve the 2020 – 2021 Sovereign Grand Lodge budget. The budget was passed with all of Oregon's Representatives voting yes.

How our Drive-In style event works:

- -Cars will be parked every other space as directed by a parking attendant who will guide your car. We will instruct you in parking in a way that will face the Bingo MCs. The lot will be open for cars to start parking 1 hour before show time.
- -An attendant will then come to your car to check you in, and deliver your Bingo cards. Masks on, please.
- -Attendants will also come around to your car to take any snack and soda orders. You can alert an attendant that you need something by putting on your turn signal. We will have a square to take all major debit/credit card. For safety reasons, no cash will be accepted.
- -Guests are welcome to keep their windows cracked and masks off during Bingo, but if an attendant approaches your car, you must put your mask back on.
- -What do you do If you get a BINGO? Simply honk your car horn and put your hazard lights on to alert our MCs. An attendant will come to you to check your card. If your Bingo is "good." you can tell our attendant which prize you'd like and they will bring it to your car.
- -Bathrooms: The bathrooms inside the lodge will be available, but use at your own risk. We will have an attendant inside to monitor usage and to clean them intermittently throughout the evening, but we cannot guarantee the bathrooms will be cleaned after each use. Prepare accordingly and BYO sanitizing products.
- -If you need to leave your vehicle for any reason, masks are required and will be enforced. We reserve the right to remove any party from the event who refuses to follow social distancing and mask wearing guidelines.
