


#### It Was a Big Busy Day in Canyonville

#### UNEP Delegates Return

In the August OPOF, I reported about the UNEP tour as it was leaving New York. The Delegates spent the next day (Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup>) driving north and on Friday they toured Ottawa. Saturday they headed back south and toured the Corning Glass Museum in Corning, NY. Sunday they toured Gettysburg and then drove into Washington, DC. For the next 3 days they toured Washington, DC. They spent time at the Smithsonian Museums, US Capital, Supreme Court Building, Library of Congress, and Arlington Cemetery. The Delegates also toured the memorials for Roosevelt, King, and WWII.

From everything I have heard, this was a very successful trip. The Delegates repeatedly have told me that they had a great time. I hope you are all proud of them and proud of our lodges for sponsoring this wonderful program.




